
A 17-week group intervention program for men who have abused, neglected or exposed their children to domestic violence

Evaluation impact demonstrates...

- Fewer incidents of domestic violence
- Reduced risks to children
- Decreased parenting stress & level of hostility
- Improved interaction with mens' children
- Sustained improvements in fathers' behaviour & increased feelings of safety and wellbeing in families
